
With that, we laughed and I said - well sort of like passing away, but I will be going away but will be back to say "hi!"

### News from the Health Room

### **Guidelines for Keeping Your Student Home Due to Illness**

#### Keep your child home if he/she has:

- 1. <u>Fever</u>: Your child should remain at home with a fever greater than 100.4 degrees. A child can return to school after he/she has been fever free for 24 hours (without fever-reducing medication such as Tylenol or Motrin)
- 2. <u>Diarrhea/Vomiting</u>: A child with diarrhea and/or vomiting should stay home and return to school after being symptom free for 24 hours
- 3. **Rashes:** A child with a suspicious rash should return to school only after a health care provider has made a diagnosis and authorized the child's return to school.
- 4. <u>Colds:</u> Consider keeping your child home if he/she is experiencing discomfort from cold symptoms, such as nasal congestion and cough. A continuous green discharge from the nose may be a sign of infection. Consider having your child seen by your health care provider.

Your child is expected to be picked up from school in a timely manner when sick, to reduce the spread of illness to other students and/or staff. Please make sure your cell phones are checked throughout your day if parents need to be contacted. All phone numbers need to be up to date in the school office.

#### **Spring Allergies:**

- Please be sure that you are observing your child for signs and symptoms of allergies
- 3. It is important that your child be given allergy medication before symptoms start
- Many children will have watery, red, itchy eyes and over the counter eye drops will help if given before school

### **3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Parents:**

Please send in your child's updated physical. All 4<sup>th</sup> grade students are required by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health to have a physical on file going into 4<sup>th</sup> grade. Any physical dated Aug 1, 2014 or after will qualify.

#### Spring=Mud:

1. Please be sure that your child has back up clothing, season appropriate, available at school. The health room cannot be responsible for clothing your wet child. Your child may end up uncomfortable or you may receive a call asking you to come to school with back up clothing.
